

## **EYFS Instructions Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> March 2020.**

**Phonics:** Keep an eye out in your emails. Mrs Jervis is sorting out phonics lessons on zoom that the children can join in on. Attached is an alphabet strip they will need and also the Phase 3 sound mat in their learning packs.

In the meantime go onto [www.phonicsplay.co.uk](http://www.phonicsplay.co.uk) click on Phase 3 and play on giggling graphemes practising phase 3. Then go onto Buried Treasure phase 4 polysyllabic words. In your books try writing the sentence This frog is chomping on pondweed.

**Maths:** If you have the book What the Ladybird Heard by Julia Donaldson could you read this story. If you haven't go onto YouTube What the Ladybird Heard by Tumble Tiddlers and they will read the story.

Then look at the ladybird maths attached. Cut the ladybirds up and the children find different ways to make 10 using the spots. You could play it as a matching pairs game or the children just try and find the matching halves. The blank ladybirds, if you need to you could extend to finding 20 or just finding 5.

Questions to Extend and Deepen Understanding

While the children are completing the challenge, you may wish to ask them the following questions:

- How many spots are on this part of the ladybird?
- How many spots are on your ladybird altogether?
- Can you find another way to make ten?
- How many more spots do you need to make ten?
- I think there are ten spots on this ladybird. Am I correct? Why? Why not?
