

Year 1 Instructions for Wednesday 29th April 2020.

Good Morning! Hope you are all safe and well.

Phonics: Choose a session from Mrs. Jervis that you haven't done.

Practise spelling the words some, come, who and were. Remember these are tricky words so they cannot be sounded out you just have to remember how they are spelt.

Then go onto www.phonicsplay.co.uk Phase 5 play Picnic on Pluto (Phase 5) and choose ph. Remember it makes the 'f' sound.

Maths: Go onto BBC Teach Supermovers KS1 Maths and select counting with John Farnworth.

In your books, and using objects to help find $\frac{1}{2}$ of 10, $\frac{1}{2}$ of 16, $\frac{1}{2}$ of 14, $\frac{1}{2}$ of 12.

Then go onto www.whiterosemaths.com. Go onto home learning Year 1 and watch Lesson 2 (27/4) Finding a quarter and then complete attached worksheet.

English: We are starting a new write based on the story of The Three Little Pigs. You will be rewriting the story from the viewpoint of the Wolf. Was he good or bad? You decide.

If you have the book The TRUE story of the 3 Little Pigs as told by A. Wolf by Jon Scieska read it through with somebody. If not the story is told on You Tube, "The TRUE story of the 3 Little Pigs as told by A. Wolf to Jon Scieska, Grandma Annii's story time.

In your book, draw a picture of the Wolf and then decide if you believe his story, give reasons for your answer.

R.E. What makes some places sacred?

Based on what we have learnt already about Islam and Christianity in class, look at the pictures attached to the home learning page. Cut them out and sort them into whether you think they are important to Muslims or Christians. Split a page of your book in half and label one side Muslims and the other Christians and then stick the pictures in. Can you label any of the pictures?
