KS2 Art Friday 15th May

Greek God or Goddess sculpture, collage or drawing





Learning Objectives

- Improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials (for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay).
- Create a 3-D form using malleable or rigid materials, or a combination of materials. View progression

Knowledge

Malleable materials, such as clay, papier-mâché and Modroc, are easy to change into a new shape. Rigid materials, such as cardboard, wood or plastic, are more difficult to change into a new shape and may need to be cut and joined together using a variety of techniques.

Task

Draw, paint, collage or make a giant 3-D head of Medusa (or your chosen Greek god or goddess).

If you choose to make 3-D model, look at images of the Easter Island carvings for scale and inspiration and Greek sculptures for authenticity and style. Before sculpting, make drawings to decide on features, expressions and headwear. Think about the materials you could use (for example, a wire former and papier mâché or Modroc).

Once dry, paint with colour or use sponges to create the effect of stone or marble. You could even make a plinth and a column to display it on.
