

Year 1 Instructions for Wednesday 6th May 2020.

Good Morning! Hope you are all safe and well and continuing to have fun.

Phonics: Choose a session from Mrs. Jervis.

Go onto www.phonicsplay.co.uk Phase 5 and scroll down to alternative spelling oa. Choose Phoneme Spotter. Read through the text and write down any graphemes that make the oa sound whilst you are reading (hint there are 6 different ways). After click on the reveal graphemes button to see how you did.

Maths: Complete any work from Monday or Tuesday first. Then go onto www.whiterosemaths.com and select Lesson 3 (add together and find a part).

Complete the worksheet.

Play Karate cats on BBC bitesize addition and subtraction bronze level.

English: If you haven't finished your plan then continue your plan.

If you have finished, you need to write the beginning of your story. How is your story going to start? Remember it's a traditional tale, here are some story starter ideas, you could use one of these or think of how you may want to start.

Once upon a time.....
In a faraway land.....
Thewas not very happy.....
In a distant land.....

The wolf was fed up.....
There was once a.....
Once there was awho....
Long, long ago.....

Remember to grab your reader from the start, draw them into your story. Is the wolf going to tell the story? Remember sentences need to make sense. Think it, say it, write it. Neat handwriting with those letters (particularly m,n,p,d,b) formed correctly. Capital letters, full stops.

R.E. This work will take a couple of weeks, so don't feel it all has to be done today. We are starting to look at why church is sacred to Christians.

On Youtube there is REQuest: Tour of church (there are 5 parts so don't feel you have to watch them all at once).

Think about when and why people go to church. In your books draw pictures to show when people go e.g. a wedding and write a label.

You may want to design your own stained glass window.
