

## **EYFS Instructions for Friday 1<sup>st</sup> May 2020.**

Good Morning! I hope you have all had a fun week and managed to get outside despite the weather! Enjoy your weekend and stay safe.

**Phonics:** Watch a Phonics session with Mrs. Jervis.

Then try reading these sentences:

Mum said "It is best not to jump on the bed.

A lost chimp felt so sad he wept.

This belt is so tight it hurts my waist.

**Maths:** On Cbeebies iPlayer, watch Numberblocks episode "Balancing Bridge."

Then you could: Make some different patterns using different objects, printing, drawing, painting.

Have a go at the counting to 20 sheet on the home learning page, challenging you to count in 2s to 20.

Or play I spy (sheets on home learning page) how many of each different thing can you find.

Go on Bud's number garden on BBC bitesize and play some games.

It's up to you.

**Literacy:**

Finish your story from yesterday if needed

Try the pencil control sheets remember when doing the patterns try not to lift your pencil off the paper before the end.

**Understanding the World.** You could:

Find out about different houses around the world. What unusual houses can you find?

Or

Design your own house. What would it look like? What would you build it out of. You could design it on paper or find some materials and have a go at building a house.

Or

Make a model of your house.

Don't forget to read/ share books.

If you are looking for other phonics books to read, [www.oxfordowl.co.uk](http://www.oxfordowl.co.uk) currently have a free e library of many books. You do need to register but it's free. Once registered if you look at the ebooks. Click on levels and you need Letters and Sounds phase as that's the phonics scheme we use in school. Look at current books you have and that's the phase your child is on. It will be Phase 2,3 or 4. If they are reading easily try the next phase. Don't go past Phase 4 as they haven't learnt the sounds beyond that phase yet. You can choose a book and it downloads immediately. Sharing books together at home is also a great way to help develop reading.
