

Year 1 Instructions for Friday 1st May 2020.

Good Morning! Hope you are all having fun despite the weather.

Phonics: Choose a phonics session with Mrs. Jervis.

Then try writing these words (Quickwrite)

might, bright, strike, kite, behind, cried, dry, reply.

Maths: On Cbeebies iPlayer watch Numberblocks episode Balancing Bridge.

Then complete any unfinished work.

In your books complete these questions, use objects to help you. Remember when you're finding half you splitting into 2 groups, when you're finding a quarter you are splitting into 4 groups.

$\frac{1}{2}$ of 30, $\frac{1}{2}$ of 18, $\frac{1}{4}$ of 20, $\frac{1}{4}$ of 16, $\frac{1}{2}$ of 24, $\frac{1}{2}$ of 12, $\frac{1}{4}$ of 8, $\frac{1}{4}$ of 24

There is a fractions task set on My Maths too.

English: Complete any unfinished work.

Watch on YouTube Nessy Spelling Strategy plural -s, -es, Learn to spell.

Complete attached worksheets.

Geography: Think of a favourite local place you like to go to, draw a map from your house to that place, think about what you may pass on the way and remember to draw that on.

Add labels to your map saying why you like something.

So for example, I live near Sutton Bank so I would draw a route from my house to the visitor's centre, in particular the café. I may write as my label "I love eating cake here."

And stick the label next to the café.

Music: Go onto www.charanga.com and select one of the activities to go on

Don't forget to share books and read.

If you are looking for other phonics books to read, www.oxfordowl.co.uk currently have a free e library of many books. You do need to register but it's free. Once registered if you look at the ebooks. Click on levels and you need Letters and Sounds phase as that's the phonics scheme we use in school. Look at current books you have and that's the phase your child is on. It will be Phase 4 or 5. If they are reading Phase 4 easily, try Phase 5. You can choose a book and it downloads immediately. Sharing books together at home is also a great way to help develop reading.
