Find 5 things in your house to measure using the same object (eg brick, cube, pencil) Which is the longest, shortest, tallest?

Then we are looking at skills in our writing sequence. A quick revision of adding -ing to words complete the worksheet on home learning page.

**Art:** We are continuing looking at LS Lowry. If you need to watch the clip on BBC Bitesize (LS Lowry in his own words) again to remind you
