12cm, 14cm, 8cm, 3cm, 6cm.


Then try the following questions cut out and stick the questions in your books and then answer them.

Unfortunately, Jack has misplaced his ribbon.



He says,

My ribbon is shorter than Claire's, but longer than Annie's.

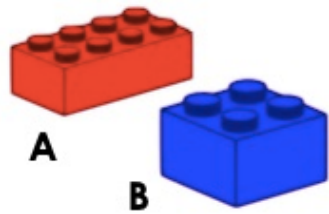
