Indirect Speech

Speech can be written in two ways:

Direct speech where the exact words spoken are put into speech marks;

Indirect speech where the exact words are not used so speech marks are not needed.

Look at these two sentences:

- 1. The man said, "My dog can run very fast."
- 2. The man said his dog could run very fast.

Sentence one is direct speech; the give away is the speech marks.

Sentence two is indirect speech, as the exact words are not being used.
