You need to draw a map of the island using a standardised key to show the different features.

A standardised key are symbols that are used on all maps so features can be easily recognised.

On your map, you need to mark on:

The cities of Heraklion and Chania.

Palace of Knossos (historical site)

Airports

The main road (E75)

Lake Kournas

Also show where the Aegean and Mediterranean Seas are.

Make sure you have a clear key and use a map of Crete to help locate the places. Below are the symbols for different features.

Task 1 (for today) Years 5 and 6

You need to draw a map of the island to scale and using a standardised key to show the different features.

A map drawn to scale means that cm will represent km. You need to decide what scale you will use. For example will 1cm = 1km or 10cm= 1km etc. Remember your map needs to be big enough for you to show the features.

The dimensions of Crete: It is 260km long and 56km at its widest point.

Remember to show your scale at the bottom left hand side of the map 1km = ??cm. You need to draw your map accurately using your scale, use standardised symbols to represent the different features, so your map will need a clear and concise key too.

On your map you need to mark on:

The cities of Heraklion and Chania


Palace of Knossos (historical buildings)

Airports

The main road (E75)

Lake Kournas.
