Next, talk to parents, write the title and poet if you can and write a sentence about each poetry feature below:

- 1. Rhythm (Is it a fast or slow beat/rhythm?Sad or jolly rhythm?)
- 2. Verse form (Is the poem just one verse? How many lines? More than one verse? Same number of lines in each verse?)
- 3. Is there any alliteration in this poem? (words that start with the same sound)
- 4. Is there any rhyme? Does it follow a pattern? E.g every line rhymes every 2 lines rhyme?
- 5. Are there any similes?
- 6. Are there any metaphors?

- 7.If there wasn't evidence of alliteration, make up a line or phrase using alliteration which would link to your poem choice.
- 8. If there wasn't evidence of simile, make up an example which would link to your poem choice.
- 9. If there wasn't evidence of metaphor, make up an example which would link to your poem choice
