Spelling: Make a poster showing the homophone their/there/they're You need to show the difference between the meanings in your poster. Remember their (belonging e.g. their bags) there is an action (go over there!) and they're is short for they are.

Maths: Find an old box (e.g. cereal box) and carefully open it up. What 2D shapes can you see? How many?

We will be looking at 3D shapes today so go on a shape hunt around your house and try and find a cube, cuboid, sphere, cylinder, cone and pyramid.

You may want to try making some 3D shapes using objects around your house. See what you can make.

English: We are continuing to look at adjectives and adverbs, if needed finish the worksheets from yesterday. If you have finished think of some adjectives to describe the following objects. Draw them in your book first then think of as many adjectives as you can to describe them. Try to avoid words like big, small, nice, good, bad see if you can think of other words that mean the same thing.
