Year 2 Instructions for Monday 8th June 2020.

Good Morning! I hope you all had a lovely weekend, and hopefully summer will come back soon.

Spelling: Over the next couple of weeks we are going to be investigate homophones. A homophone is when 2 words sound the same but mean different things, they are also usually spelt differently. For example here and hear.

Then complete the attached sheet, draw a picture to match the word. Can you think of any other homophones?

Maths: This week Year 2 will be revising fractions. Today they will be looking at unit fractions. They need to know that a unit fraction is one part of a whole. For example $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$ etc.

Go onto <u>www.whiterosemaths.com</u> Week 7 Lesson 1 and watch the video. Then complete the worksheets attached to home learning.

English: If needed complete your map and plan from last week first.

Then we are at the WRITE part of the sequence.

You need to write the directions for Little Red Riding Hood to help her get from her house to Grandma's house.

Things you need to remember whilst you are writing your directions.

- 1. They need to be in time order. Make sure you are using your map to help you and you are taking her along the path in a logical way.
- 2. Remember to start a new line for each instruction using either bullet points or numbers.
- 3. Start each sentence with your imperative verb: Eg Go down the road past the old oak tree. Turn right at the crossroads etc.
- 4. Keep your sentences short and snappy.
- 5. Draw the map neatly as a picture within your instructions, use a key to label the key features Red Riding Hood will pass.
- 6. When finished, get someone at home to follow your instructions to see if they get from Red Riding Hood's cottage to Grandma's easily.
- 7. You may want to write things, avoid the wolf, hide from the wolf etc whilst you are writing.

Art: We are going to start drawing a part of Osmotherley in the style of LS Lowry. We have explored how he has drawn his buildings, the colours he used and how he drew his people. If you would like to be reminded about LS Lowry and his works have a look at the links below.
