I hope that you have been able to take advantage of some of the opportunities for coming into school this half term. Thank you to everyone who attended the parent consultations to discuss the children's learning and it was lovely to see the new Reception parents at the phonics drop-in session. The children enjoyed 'teaching the adults' and showing off their new knowledge at our open mornings and our parent and carer lunches seem to be more popular than ever. At our celebration assembly, in addition to the house team award, sporting achievements, reading raffle and Kerry's Way award winners, we have introduced a new award the 'Osmotherley School Learner of the Week' award.
