Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome to the new academic year. I hope all of our families had a lovely summer break despite the ropey weather. Although it is frustrating that the sun has finally come out just as the children have returned to school, the first few days back have been wonderful and our new starters have been enjoying their outdoor area and have settled really well. There is a calm, happy atmosphere around the school. Everyone looks happy to be back. Hopefully they are well-rested and ready for the exciting challenges ahead.

Reading

Thank you to all the parents who supported their children with their reading, spelling and times tables recall over the holidays. Well done to the children who completed Mrs Edgeworth's reading challenge (I believe there will be prizes at the celebration assembly on Monday). We will continue to everything we can to instil a love of reading in all of our pupils this year. Not only has research shown that a love of reading is the strongest indicator of future educational success, but also books can transport us to worlds of adventure and bring us knowledge and such pleasure. We appreciate your support in helping your children to practise when they are learning to read and in sharing books and talking about books with them when they can read fluently. Every time parents or carers read with their children and sign the reading record book, their child is awarded a raffle ticket. The raffle is drawn at our Monday morning assembly and the child with the winning ticket can bring a friend to the staffroom for a hot chocolate at breaktime.

Attendance and Punctuality

Last year our attendance was 97.4 %, which is considerably higher that the national average of 94%. We are so pleased because attendance and punctuality have a huge impact on children's learning. Children who frequently miss days of school or who arrive late, miss steps in their learning which have to be caught up. Learning moves at a pace, right from Reception, so it is important to ensure that children attend if at all possible. They should stay at home if they have a high temperature or if they have had sickness or diarrhoea within the last 48 hours, but otherwise they should attend and, of course, parents and carers will be contacted if a child is not well enough to be at school. Term-time holidays are not authorised, except in exceptional circumstances, for the reasons outlined above, and the DFE plan to issue fines rather that leaving this to the discretion of headteachers.

Online Safety

At school, pupils are closely supervised when they are online and the school has installed the highest safety settings possible and internet safety is a key part of our computing and the PSHE curriculum. This year, in line with recommendations in the updated Keeping Children Safe in Education 2023, we will be monitoring internet use even more closely, including regular checking of the children's chrome books. At home, we would strongly advise parents and carers to be equally vigilant. We can never be too careful.
