#### Robinwood

Our Y5/6 children travelled to Dobroyd Castle in Todmorden for their 3 day residential visit at the Robinwood outward-bound centre. They all succeeded in completing all of the challenges including the zipwire, the giant swing, climbing, canoeing, caving, escaping from a piranha pool...to name just a few. Their positivity, teamwork and encouragement for one another made Mrs Edgeworth and myself feel very proud of them. They were certainly a credit to their families and their school.

#### **Sowerby Music For Life**

The children were treated to a day full of music and a chance to work with two talented musicians, Eleanore Sian and Sarah Beattie. #### **Sports**

All of our pupils have participated in sports with children from other small schools this term. Our Y1 and Y2 pupils ran in a fun run at Northallerton School and they were joined by our Reception pupils to take part in a multiskills event at Hambleton Leisure Centre. The Y3 & Y4 pupils and then the Y5 & Y6 pupils took part in quick-sticks hockey tournaments and the Y4, Y5 & Y6 pupils took part in football tournaments, including a girls football tournament. Competition is a key component in the National Curriculum for PE so we take every opportunity to participate in these small school cluster events. They offer the chance for our pupils to practise, improve, have fun and develop the valuable skills of fair play and teamwork.

#### **Debate at County Hall**

Our Y5/6 pupils joined pupils from the Northallerton town schools to take part in a debate in the council chambers at County Hall last week. Freddie and Seth delivered speeches for and against the motion, 'This house believes that all pupils should be allowed a mobile phone at school'. Lively arguments and challenging questions from the audience provided an educational and entertaining morning. Thank you to the Rotary Club for organising the event.
